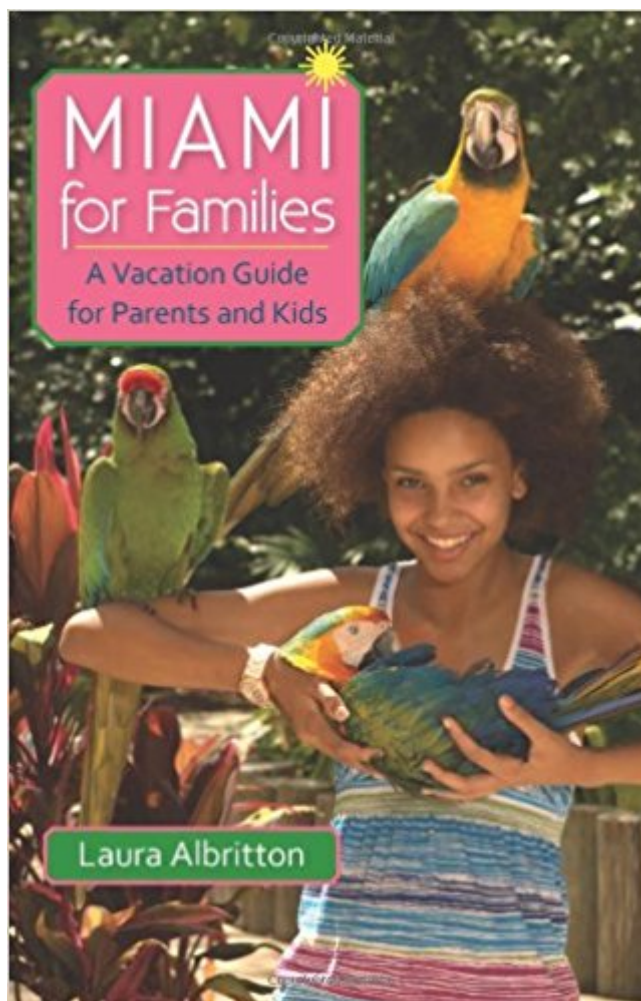

Yesterday I again picked it up to read more on a new park we wanted to check out. Laura Albritton hasn't steered us wrong yet! My favorite part about it is that she writes about parking, directions, child friendly restaurants and pricing (parking, restaurants etc). I also love that it is up to date!

I always thought of Miami as beaches, clubs and of catering to a "party" crowd. While that exists, this vacation guide for families highlighted so many pleasant surprises, and showcased the depth that Miami has to offer beyond that image. I searched for guidebooks that hit that "sweet-spot" for families, and though there were a few hits for older books, this one did the trick perfectly. The authors blend of Miami history by area, with things to do for all members of a family including children made for riveting reading, and created a sense of excitement of the places to see and go to. I found the maps very useful for getting a sense of scale and what can be accomplished within a time frame for "little feet", interspersed with ideal locations for the inevitable food stops when the family members start to get cranky for fuel. The author's perspective obviously comes from the point of view of having to cater to younger and more grown up tastes and succeeds in satisfying both. Personally I'm looking forward trying out the suggested eating spots as well as as going to Fairchild Tropical Gardens, Jungle island, the Zoo and maybe hitting the keys if there is enough time.
