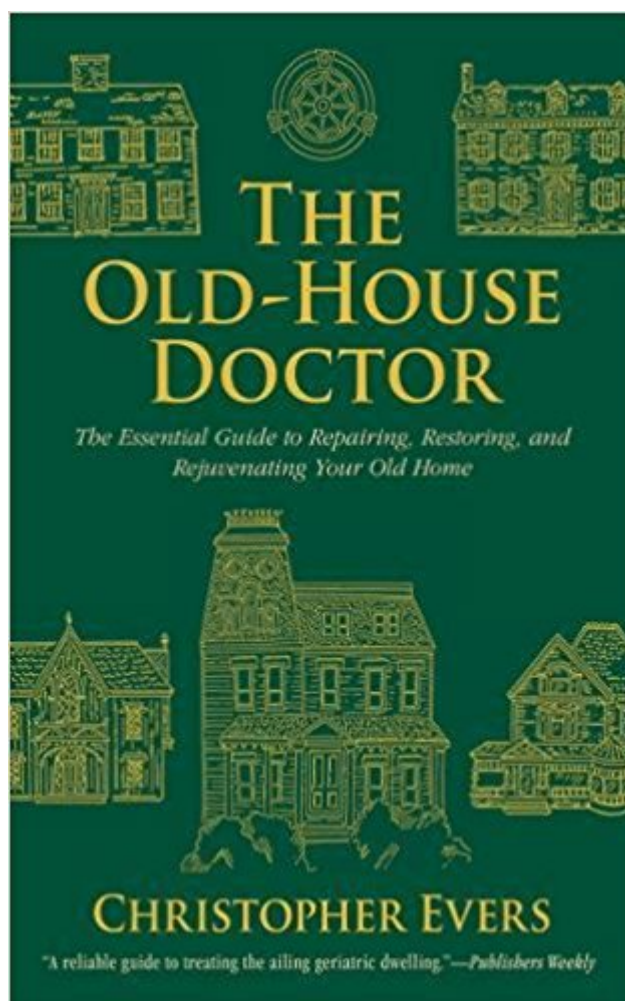

The author, a professional carpenter with more than 20 years' experience in "doctoring" old houses, provides the layperson with a reliable guide to treating the ailing geriatric dwelling. Evers teaches the reader how to research the history of an old house through deeds, records, maps and genealogies, and the house's integral structure and on-site archeological remains. He prescribes remedies for crooked frames, wood damage caused by fungus and insects, and faulty walls,

ceilings and floors. Chapters on plumbing, wiring, ventilation, energy conservation and decoration, as well as sources of old house materials and a comprehensive bibliography, are included. Evers's enthusiasm for his subject makes for reading that is as entertaining as it is enlightening. To Evers, an old house is a sort of living organism, much like the human body. Thus, the wiring becomes the house's nervous system, the frame its skeleton, the doors and windows its sense organs, and naturally wood rot and termites its major maladies. Such analogies can easily stretch too thin, but Evers's reverential treatment and purist's sensibility create and sustain a certain enchantment. He also offers up loads of good, solid information on the make-up of old houses and the work needed to reverse the debilitations of old age. And even though his book lacks the degree of detail to be considered a how-to manual, the excellent bibliography directs the reader to many such sources for additional help.
