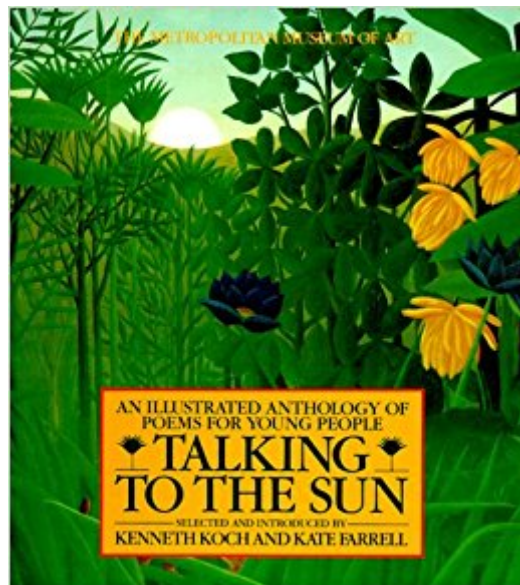

With exquisite care, Koch and Farrell chose paintings and creations in other media from the Metropolitan Museum's extensive exhibits to illustrate poems about love in its many forms; about nature, animals, magic; songs celebrating nonsense and surprisethe small and big things in life. Grade 5 Up The ingredients for a wonderful collection are here: the poems selected are strong and true and are accompanied by gorgeous photographs of treasures from the Metropolitan Museum of Art. The reproductions are of exceptional quality and are printed on heavy, glossy paper. Instead of inspiring, however, the book overwhelms. Each page in the ten sections is crammed with several

poems, photos of artwork, information about the artwork, information about the poet and often an "explanation" of the poem that reduces it to its most simplistic level, robbing it of its mystery and richness. Lear's "The Owl and the Pussy-cat," for example, is followed by the sentence "A silly-seeming poem can inspire a serious feeling, like the desire to sail far, far away." I chanced to see this book *Talking to the Sun* in the early Eighties while browsing the Metropolitan Museum of Art's kiosk at Macy's. The attractive dust jacket as well as the colorful drawings captured my attention. I was sure my son, then barely two, would find it a welcome distraction during the hours of travel and waiting in airports as he accompanied me when I traveled internationally for my career. He loved the book. I read it to him cover to cover countless times, and then he began to turn the pages himself and he read it to me. He was an early reader, who became fascinated with many books as he grew older, but *Talking to the Sun* was always his favorite. When he was sixteen, our entire family moved to South America. He reluctantly gave up the books from his childhood to a children's library with other books we could not carry with us. Fifteen years later, he is preparing to welcome his own son to the world. His dad and I began a search for *Talking to the Sun*. We were disappointed to discover that this wonderful book was nowhere to be found in traditional bookstores. It was just too wonderful a book to just pull up online; we wanted our grandson to hold it in his hands and have the same joy our son had in turning the colorful pages and murmuring, "Come unto these yellow sands/and then join hands; and then join hands!" When we found the book online we were overjoyed--and our son is excitedly awaiting the arrival of this book to read to his firstborn.

Although the format reminds me of a textbook, my two year old loves it, and I have a hunch it'll stay on her bookshelf for at least a decade. Right now she is mostly into looking at, and talking about, the artwork, but they're a few poems she'll ask me to read. This is a great way to introduce a child to art and literature.

My aunt gave me this book when I was 9 or 10 years old and it kindled a love of poetry that persists today. The poems are organized by theme and paired with lovely artwork related to the poem or theme. There is a wide variety of poems from well-loved standards to more modern American poets to a multi-cultural smattering of translated poems. It's a shame this book is out of print, because I

think it is one of the best ways to transition from Shel Silverstein to more literary poems. Not to be snobby about Shel Silverstein, whose poems I still enjoy!
