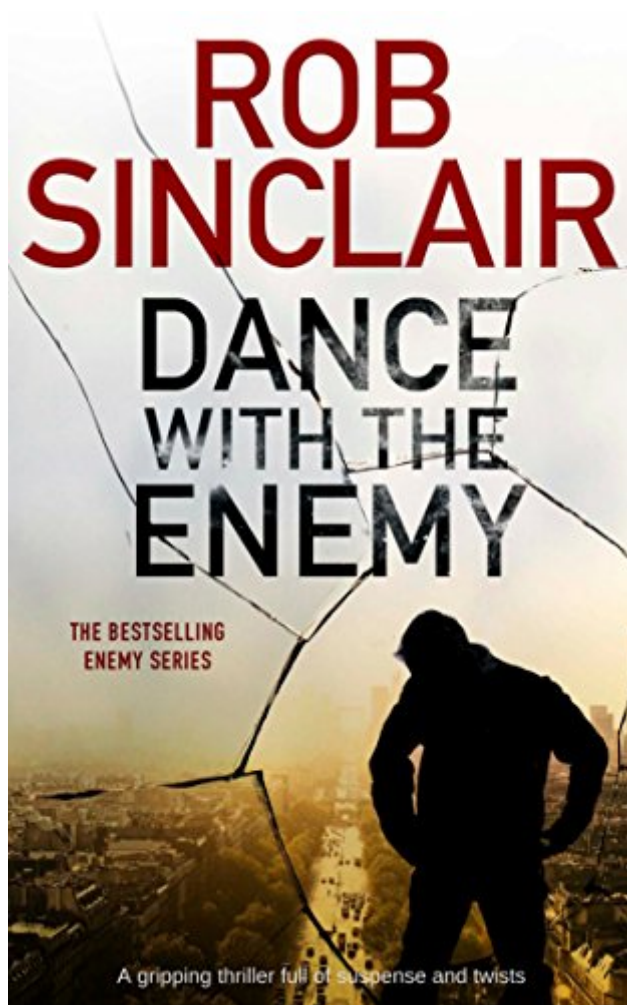




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Dance With The Enemy (Enemy Series Book 1)

Dance with the Enemy had me gripped right from the start as I love an action packed book, in Afrikaans we have a saying for this type of book or movie - SKOP, SKIT EN DONNER, which translated means kick, shoot and beat up. I read this in two days and could not put this fast paced book down. Carl Logan kind of reminded me of Jack Reacher who is an all time favourite of mine, and does things his way and disregards rules. I love a tough macho character who also has a softer side and shows a bit of emotion, which Logan eventually did later on in the book. I really loved the way his past unfolded and it was revealed why he was on medical leave and how he coped with his demons from the past. I loved the way the story line kept on changing and new characters kept on popping up and apart from Carl, another favourite of mine was his boss Mackie. This thriller is full of twists and turns and is definitely not for the faint hearted and squeamish as the torture scenes are pretty graphic and don't leave much to the imagination, Selim was truly despicable and psychotic character who enjoyed inflicting pain on his victims. The ending left me with my mouth hanging open as I did not see that coming and was left wondering just how Logan was going to be able to cope

with it after his traumatic past. I am also looking forward to finding out (hopefully) more about Logan's earlier years, up to the age of 17 when Mackie took him under his wing and taught him all he knows. I found Rob Sinclair to be an excellent thriller writer, and am surprised that this is his first novel, and I am so looking forward to the next book in this trilogy. This book is an unpredictable story with true-to-life characters. It took me on a thrilling journey with many twists and turns that kept me begging for more. I found myself cheering on the main character, Carl Logan (Logan). Carl Logan is the best intelligence agent on the staff at JIA (Joint Intelligence Agency). This agency is unique because it is run by government officials from the US and the UK. Carl Logan is a loner. He works alone and feels he can accomplish more this way. Logan was on medical leave from the beating and torture he suffered by well-known terrorist, Youssef Salim, when he was assigned on a mission to find US Attorney General Frank Modena. Modena was abducted while in Paris on negotiations. The JIA was against Logan taking this case because they felt he had not fully recovered. Charles McCabe (Mackie), Logan's boss, was hesitant but assured the board he was indeed ready. Mackie had no doubt Logan was the right agent for this case, but he too was concerned it may be too soon and Logan wasn't ready.
