

This was a terrific help for planning a trip to this area. If you need help on a driving tour with routes, sites to see, and accommodations, then this is the book you need.

Delving into this book is like sitting in an English parlor and having an intimate conversation over the tea cups. After some good pages of advice on planning the trip (getting reasonable airline tickets, renting a car, etc.), the authors launch into narratives of their nine chosen itineraries, both detailed driving directions and what to see off the beaten track--even what's crowded all year (Stonehenge) and what to see instead (Avebury). Then there's an extensive section in which each page is devoted to one of the B&Bs and inns they personally recommend, including a charming drawing of the facade of each, with contact information and prices (updated annually, apparently). Drawings enliven the itineraries section as well, along with clear hand-drawn maps. I'm planning a leisurely experience of Britain, rather than a busy-busy tour, and this book is definitely going to help.

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
