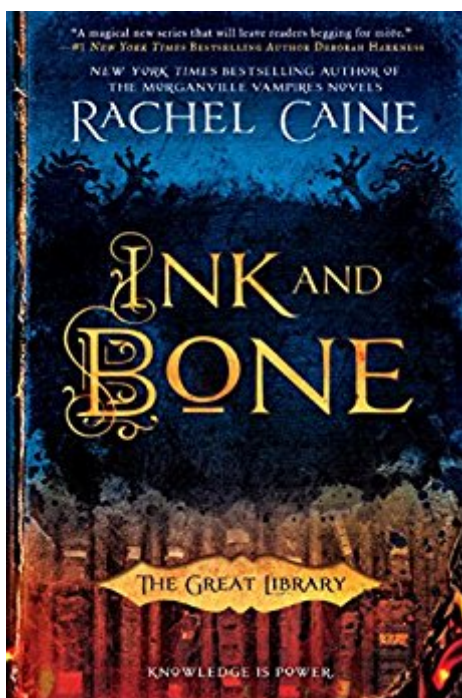

But it is very much set in the past. The great library of Alexandria still exists and has firm hold of the world and controls everything. The ability to reproduce text does not exist, the Great Library made sure of that. Made sure no progress was made to harm the library in any way, and that includes peoples rights to own and produce there own books. Everyone has blanks, where they can have access to a book temporary before it fades away. Because books are rare there is an underground blackmarket for them, and Jess's family, the Brightwell's, runs one of the best smugglers of books. But Jess isn't really cut out for this life so his father gets him in to work for the Library. Jess must go through class and test to learn how to work for the Library and it is much hard than he ever imagined. Along the way, Jess sees that the Library wasn't everything he always thought it was and finds out more about the dirty underside of the library and all the secrets that were held to preserve the library's rule. This book is very dark. There is a lot of death and despair. But there is also friendship and love as well. There is no romance scene, it is very much action pack on the edge of your seat pulling for the characters. This books really pulls at your emotions, it has this raw quality to it. The characters are all very much fleshed out and you really get to see each character's personality, no two are alike. I would definitely recommend this book!

development to meet its ends. To design, build, or even know of a device that might circumvent the Library's power is to risk your life. It matters little what your motives are. Even nations know that to challenge the orthodoxy is to become an enemy of the greatest power on Earth. To ensure its supremacy, the Library delivers books directly to the citizenry, on a worldwide basis. The caveat is that the ownership of original books is forbidden, to be caught in possession of one is a death sentence. But, where prohibitions exist there will be those who desire that which is denied them—and black marketers to supply that desire. Additionally, there is organized, and deadly opposition to the dictates of the Great Library from a group called the "Burners." These terrorists don't merely want to circumvent the Library's rules; they want to destroy it utterly and do not care if innocents stand in their way. Into this dangerous, arcane world Jess Brightwell was born. His father, and indeed the whole Brightwell clan, are sellers of illicit books. At ten he is running books across London to satisfy a buyer's perverted taste. At sixteen he is packed off to be his father's spy within the Library's bureaucracy. To accomplish that mission, all he has to do is complete a course of dangerous, challenging training and best his fellow postulants in the bargain. Simple, right? Well, not if you take into account a war, the "Burner" terrorists, and the power mad actions of the Great Library's hierarchy. Easy? Not in the least. The ever present bloodshed, terrorism and scenes of horrific violence are leavened with competition, camaraderie, bravery, selfless loyalty and sweet teen romance among the postulants. Stalwart Glain, bonhomie Thomas, snarky Dario, brilliant Khalifa, vulnerable Morgan, daring Jess, instructor Wolfe and Captain Santi all become round and lively in the course of *Ink and Bone*. These characters and the world of the Great Alexandrian Library, so finely crafted by Rachel Caine, is a world that you will leave reluctantly. Hopefully, the wait for the next book in the series won't be a long one. Highly recommended for Steampunk aficionados.
