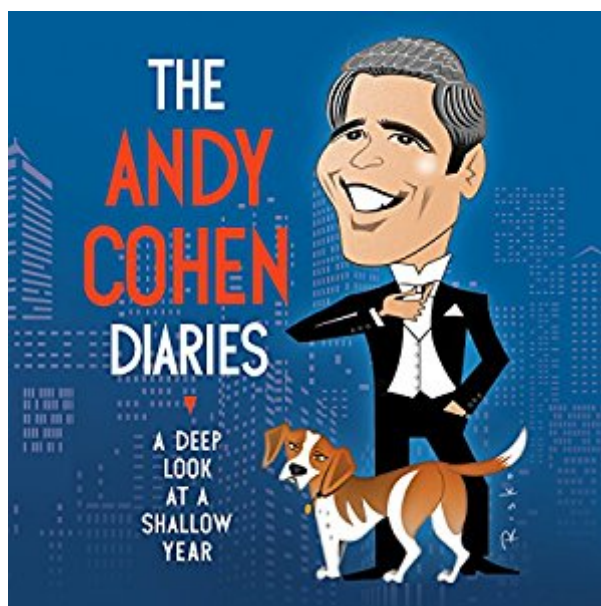

Save your money.

I love Andy Cohen; and love Watch What Happens Live-----but this is one of the singularly most boring books ever written! It's not funny, it's not entertaining, and it's not informative. It's just boring. He doesn't give enough details when he should. Further, his stories are bland and not funny. Sad that what should and could have been a fabulous book was merely mundane. I quit reading at 31 percent through. Sad.

This book is a waste of money and time. Unless you want to know how much his dog poops, how much and where Andy eats (constantly), and where he's looking for love (?) don't bother.

Wow..what a letdown!! I. Although I adore Andy Cohen and think he is highly entertaining on Bravo TV, I found this book to be a true bore midway. It seemed as if Andy was trying too hard in his book details to celebrity name drop every other sentence.
