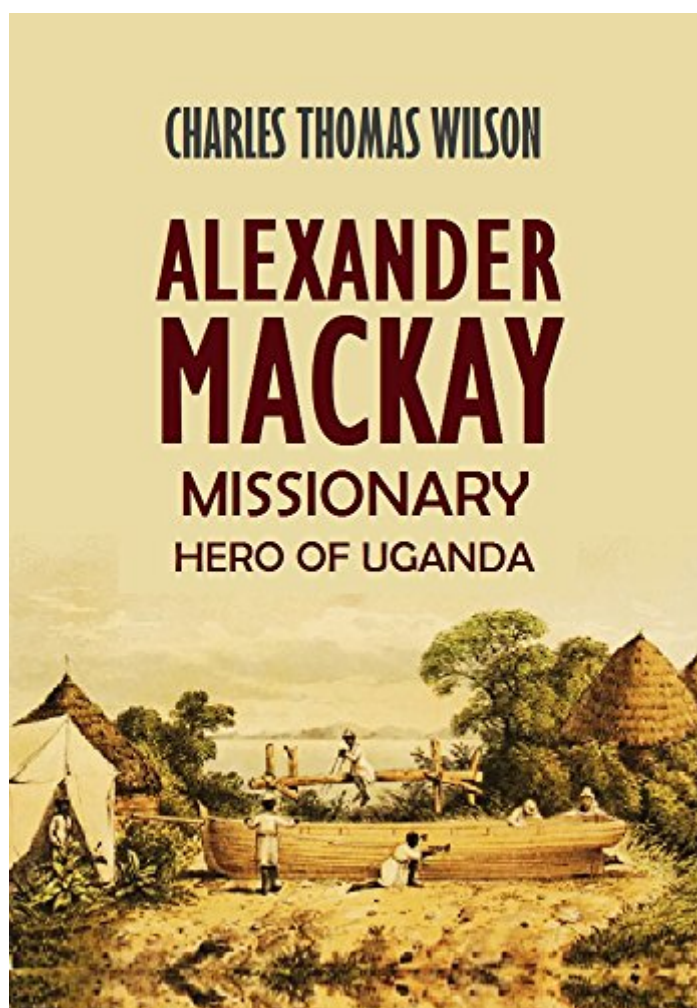

In 1894, he published the book "Alexander Mackay: Missionary Hero of Uganda."Alexander Mackay, Missionary Hero of Uganda is another volume well worthy of taking its place in the "Splendid Lives Library." It tells the life-story of its hero in language clear, forcible, and to the point. A good insight into the early history of the much-talked-of Uganda is given by this book, which shows plainly the almost insuperable difficulties the English missionaries had to deal with. Another point which is well brought out is the all-round capability of Mackay, which gained him the name of "White Man of Work" from the King, Mtesa.
