I find Heschel's writings timeless and classic and The Sabbath is no exception. Though this book is dedicated to Jewish followers, I do not think that it is exclusive for them. The Sabbath or day of rest has a powerful meaning regardless of your religious belief or philosophy. A spiritual rest day has a deep and penetrating significance and Heschel mystically touches on all aspects of it. There is a major focus on Time which brought a whole new meaning to me. For those that believe in G-d, this book brings out G-d's intention for the Sabbath. I highly recommend to read this and even practice.

I read this within 24 hours - not because it was simplistic but because it was so profound that I could not bear to put it down. Each time I set it aside, I fought a very intense battle between wanting to contemplate what he had written and wanting to go back and drink in more. I decided to drink deeply and in order to compensate I am reading it again. I will no doubt read it a great many times.

One of my favorites, and I keep a few copies on hand to share with friends. I'm Jewish so I'm always interested to see what my non-Jewish friends take away. R Heschel (z'l) was a brilliant scholar, which makes this very approachable, readable text that much more valuable to an average reader. Especially great for readers who are not Jewish and wish to learn more of the practice of Sabbath, and not just the text book reasons, but reasons of faith and passion. Wonderfully written.
