

This calendar has been a tradition of mine and I have to buy one every year. This year, .com sent it to me standard shipping and with the use of an .com e-gift card balance, I received this product in 3 days from the time of order. It was mailed in a manilla packing envelope with bubble-wrap padding. It did not include the outer shipping box as it had in years before. This time, the wire-ring bound calendar came plastic wrapped. The calendar begins on Monday, December 29, 2014 to Sunday, January 3, 2016. Inside the weekly calendar are 60 new beautiful photographs of scenic nature with an informative description of each photo, location and the name of the photographer. The lettering

of the months, days and numbers are big enough to read. Each entry of the day has space of about 6 inches wide X 1 inch high to write your appointments, meetings, video conferences, travel dates, hotel reservations, phone numbers, birthdays, anniversaries, brunch, luncheons and dinner reservations, Broadway theatre dates, college classes and exams and dates to pay your bills. Also make a note of your favorite tv shows, baseball and basketball games, movie and DVD releases, webcasts and podcasts. This year, they will have many Republican and Democrat debates for candidates campaigning to be the next President of the United States, so write those dates down too. You can use your calendar as a daily diary or journal. Included are American holidays and some holidays observed in Australia, Canada, England, France, New Zealand, North Ireland, Scotland, Wales and all of the United Kingdom. Also International holidays, Christian, Jewish, Chinese, Islamic and Muslim holidays. Moon phases, Equinox and Solstice, the beginning and end of U.S. Daylight Savings Time. Back pages include information about the National Audubon Society and how to get a 50%-off membership offer. The Audubon Directory with National and Program offices and State offices. Five one-lined pages for notes and to quickly write tasty recipes and a perpetual calendar of 2014, 2015, 2016. Information on getting a free Digital Page-A-Day online calendar and newsletter for download or email is also available. An order form is provided for a one-year membership and to subscribe to 6 issues of Audubon Magazine for 50%-off and two free Audubon Art tote bags. Calendar is printed on FSC-certified paper from responsible sources in South Korea. In the middle of the calendar is a nice piece of cardboard used for shipping. You might want to use it as a temporary cheeseboard.

The Year 2016 is set to be a big year and you are going to need the Audubon Engagement Calendar to keep yourself on schedule and remember those important dates. It is an election year, so write down the day of your caucus or primary Election Day. Write down the dates of the televised debates and the Republican National Convention (July 18-21) or Democratic National Convention (July 25-28). This wire spiral-bound calendar begins on Monday, December 28, 2015 to Sunday, January 1, 2017. Inside are 57 beautiful photographs of scenic nature with an informative description of each photo, location and name of photographer. The lettering of the months, days and numbers are big enough to read. Each entry of the day has space of about 6 inches wide X 1 inch high to write your appointments, meetings, video conferences, travel dates, hotel reservations, phone numbers, birthdays, anniversaries, brunch, luncheons and dinner reservations. Broadway theater dates, college classes and exams and dates to pay the bills. Also make a note of your favorite television programs, sports, Summer Olympic Games (August 5-21), movie and DVD

releases, webcasts and podcasts. You can use your calendar as a daily diary or journal. There are 4 lined pages for you to write notes, perhaps a tasty recipe, and a perpetual calendar of 2015, 2016 and 2017.

Information on getting an "online extra" of a free Page-A-Day digital calendar. An orange page explains how you may become an Audubon member. There is an order blank to subscribe to issues of the Audubon Magazine and 2 free Audubon Art Tote Bags and one-year membership. Calendar is printed on FSC-certified paper from responsible sources. Make it a tradition to buy the Audubon Engagement Calendar every year from .com.

I'm disappointed in this calendar. I've always gotten a cat calendar, but was too late this year in looking for one. The pictures in the Audubon calendar are beautiful, but the quality of the paper is very poor. It is very thin, and so glossy that when I wrote on it the ink from the pen never dried and it smeared. Also, the dates on each page are on the inside of the page near the spiral so that if you want to leaf through the book to find a particular date it's impossible; the dates should be on the outside of the page, I think. I won't be purchasing this engagement calendar again unfortunately.

I've purchased the Audubon Engagement Calendar every year for many years. Perfect size, exquisite photos. I save my calendars which serve as diaries to remind me of events and activities throughout my life. Most important, the money I spend on the calendars goes toward the Nat'l Audubon Society, a wonderful organization whose mission is to conserve and restore natural ecosystems, focusing on birds, other wildlife, and their habitats for the benefit of humanity and the earth.
